Background Information.

These events were originally started by the Balance Street PPG, Uttoxeter, who put on a successful Health Event at the Thomas Alleyne's High School, Uttoxeter. Unfortunately, after 2 years they ceased running these events with the last one being in 2013. The Tutbury Practice Patient Forum members agreed they would like to start a similar event for 14 / 15year old students from within the local the community. As most of this age group attend the deFerrers Academy they were approached with the view of holding a "Health Roadshow Event" during the 2013/14 school year.

Initial discussions with the Academy were held in June 2013 and the agreement was made later that month to hold the initial "Health Roadshow Event" on the 16th and 17th June 2014.

Due to the success of the inaugural event the Academy had requested if the Tutbury Practice Patient Forum would consider hosting this as an annual event. This was discussed with the members of the Forum with the agreement that if funds and presenter's availability allow, then it would be an annual event. The 2017 event will be our 4th year.

The event was originally planned for June 2017 but unfortunately due to being unable to get presenters for one of the sessions this date had to be moved to December 2017. Although the students were now in Year 10 it was the same people that would have been seen in June 2017 whilst they were coming to the end of Year 9

Aims and Objectives.

The purpose of the event was to enable Year 9 students to receive intensive one-hour sessions on health-related topics. The objective was to re-enforce the health-related teaching at the school and for the students to become more conversant of health issues in the future. The topics may vary from year to year depending on the availability of organisations and presenters. Each year every effort was made to have the following 3 core topics;

- Drugs and Alcohol
- Mental Health
- Diet and Exercise

Health Session Topics for 2017.

To achieve the above and what was learned from previous experiences, the following subjects for the event were finalised with the Academy:

- Drugs and Alcohol
- Mental Health
- Nutrition
- Body Image
- Internet Grooming / Sexting

The organisations who contacted and agreed to be the presenters of the above were;

- The O'Connor Gateway Trust in Burton for the Drugs and Alcohol Awareness sessions, (These presentations were given by people who are in recovery).
- Burton Albion Community Trust for the Nutrition sessions.
- The South Staffordshire Network for Mental Health for the Mental Health sessions.
- YMCA for the Body Image sessions
- SARAC for the Internet / Sexting sessions

Location.

The event was held at: The de Ferrers Academy, Trent Campus, St Mary's Drive, Burton upon Trent DE13 OLL

There were 3 health sessions in the morning and 2 health sessions in the afternoon. Each session was of one x hour duration and was attended by 30-35 Year 10 students.

Representation.

The Forum was represented by the Chair, Deputy Chair, Secretary and members of the Forum. The school was represented by Mr G. D. Burroughs BSc, MA Director of learning, CRE and school teachers were present at each session. We also had attendance from:

Observations made during the 2 days.

- All rooms and equipment were set up for when the presenters arrived.
- The event was held on the last 2days of term before Christmas. On hindsight the dates should have been earlier in December. The reason for this being due to the students being ready for their Christmas break and some naturally being high spirited.
- Generally, students' behaviour was good / impeccable with them actively taking part in all the sessions.
- Some sessions were very powerful with strong messages being conveyed. This was especially the case with the Drugs and Alcohol presenters
- The school staff played a part on both days. However, as will be seen from the feedback they were not always in place at the start of the sessions and in some cases lax on discipline to some rowdy students. It should be strongly pointed out that in no way is this the fault of the organisation and plans carried out beforehand by Mr Glyn Burroughs of the Academy
- From listening to the student discussions between sessions and from the comments made in their questionnaires it soon became apparent that the messages were having a positive effect.

Funding.

In terms of funding we will follow the same pathway as in previous years. All organisations and presenters offered their services without charge. However, where sessions were run by charities, the Forum had in the past sent donations to the charities. In previous years the amount donated was at the discretion of the Tutbury Practice Patient Forum and so donations for the 2017 event are due for discussion and ratification by the Forum members at their AGM in January 2018.

Event Evaluation.

Two types of evaluation were undertaken

- The students were asked to complete an evaluation questionnaire. These were carried out at the end of each session.
- The session presenters were asked to complete an evaluation questionnaire. These were carried out at the end of each day.


